# eSafety is the responsibility of our community

In collaboration with our Governing Council our school is embarking in a number of eSafety opportunities. At our recent Governing Council meeting Sally Turra, our student well-being leader, shared a number of concerning incidents occurring after school relating to eSafety. These incidents and the language associated with them are then being shared amongst the students when they return to school and causing upset. It is becoming more and more obvious that our students need significant support to navigate the internet world, including social media. Our children's interactions are very different from our own growing up and as adults we need to educate ourselves to ensure we understand fully the world our children are part of. As a result of our discussions the Governing Council will be hosting a parent information session in relation to eSafety and we will be arranging for our students to begin a series of eSafety workshops. We have also made a commitment to share eSafety information in our school newsletters. Watch this space for more information on the parent information session.

### 1. Cyberbullying - supporting your child online

Childhood bullying used to be face-to-face physical and verbal behaviour in the playground, classroom and on the way to and from school. Now online technology and constant connectivity has allowed bullying to harm children through often anonymous contact or actions. Cyberbullying can happen at any time and leave a child feeling unsafe and alone.

Cyberbullying commonly occurs through:

- \* Comments posted in an open online environment such as Facebook.
- \* Direct text, email or instant messages online or on a mobile phone.
- \* Private features on social networking services such as Snapchat and Facebook Messenger.

Children can manage cyberbullying with your support by taking the following action:

- \* Blocking the person cyberbullying and changing privacy settings. Retaliating or responding to the perpetrator only gives them the attention and power they want.
- \* **Reporting the bullying.** Most websites have online <u>safety centres</u> and reporting facilities. Online abuse is in violation of the Terms Of Use of most social networking sites. The Office of the eSafety Commission can take <u>complaints</u> and provide assistance in relation to serious cyberbullying material that is directed at a particular child with the intention to seriously embarrass, harass, threaten or humiliate.
- \* Collecting the evidence. Keeping mobile phone messages and printing emails or IM conversations.
- \* Talking to someone they trust like parents or a teacher.
- \* Visiting iParent for a list of sources of professional <u>support</u> including the Kids Helpline on 1800 55 1800, eheadspace on 1800 650 890 or <u>parentline</u>.
- \* Taking the cyberbullying quiz. There is also a quiz for parents.
- \* Watch the "Chatterbox" video and listen to the podcast about cyberbullying.

## The Adventures of Trooper Jones






#### TROOPER JONES AND HIS HOLIDAY ADVENTURE.
