If you had the chance to be the teacher tomorrow, what would you teach the class?

Did anyone push your buttons today?

Who do you want to make friends with but haven't yet? Why not?

What is your teacher's most important rule? What is the most popular thing to do at recess?

Does your teacher remind you of anyone else you know? How?

Tell me something you learned about a friend today.

If aliens came to school and beamed up 3 kids, who do you wish they would take? Why?

What is one thing you did today that was helpful? When did you feel most proud of yourself today?

Chemical Sciences in the Early Years

This term the Early Years children will be exploring materials and their properties. Our lessons consist of the sharing of information from the teacher and the students through class discussion, student expert sharing time, pair sharing and group work. Children have the opportunity to discuss their learning while taking part in exploration at stations. Photo posters are displayed outside the Early Years art room showing the science activities.

Content for the term:

Week 1: Introduction of the properties of materials: Learning Intention: We are learning about the materials around us.

Weeks 2 & 3: The use of materials around us: Learning Intention: We are learning about the uses of materials.

Week 4: Natural and Manufactured materials: Learning Intention: We are learning about the origins of materials.

Week 5 : Change and the movement of materials: Learning Intention: We are learning about the way materials move.

Weeks 6 & 7 : Change, mixing, dissolving: Learning Intention: We are learning about the way materials change when mixed.

Weeks 8 & 9: Change from heat and cold: Learning Intention: We are learning about the way materials change when heated or cooled.

Week 10 : Reduce, reuse, recycle materials: Learning Intention: We are learning about the materials that can be recycled.

Week 11: Review and assessment of the term: Learning Intention: We are reviewing the terms work on materials
