Welcome back to term 2. Things are changing so rapidly for our community at the moment and I want to thank you for embracing the change and supporting our teachers to provide teaching and learning during these exceptional circumstances.

#### KISS AND DROP REMINDER

Many parents are now choosing to use the kiss and drop zone and we are really appreciative of this as is eases some of the congestion in school at drop off and pick up times.

Please be patient when there is a long queue. We only allow students to walk down a short way to hop into their cars. We discourage them from walking down Apollo Street or entering via the staff carpark. We have many support staff that leave between 3.00-3.30pm and it makes it difficult for them to leave the carpark when students are cutting through. When students enter their cars half way down Apollo Street this results in cars driving along the outside of the kiss and drop queue and attempting to turn onto Dumas Street. This lane of traffic is only designed to be a single lane and we are increasing the risk of an accident when we double up vehicles.

We have also seen an increase of students getting out of cars in the morning when they are near the staff carpark. We would ask you not to support this practice and ask your children to stay inside the car until the designated drop off point.
