WHAT IS SCHOOL CULTURE?

I have recently received feedback from a new member of our school community who commented on our positive and welcoming school culture. School culture is the overarching success point for a school. Everything else falls by the wayside unless you establish and maintain a positive school culture.

But what is school culture? Academic research in this area has categorised it as:

CONNECTIONS

Connections are created through shared beliefs and values Actions will spread the farthest and be tightly reinforced when everyone is communicating effectively.

CORE BELIEFS AND VALUES

Some fundamental beliefs shared across our school are that we are a community of successful learners, everyone belongs and everyone has the right to achieve.

Our school values are respect, responsibility and resilience. We expect our community members to live these values in their interactions with each other.

I believe there is another important factor that has not been recognised within this research and that is KINDNESS. As part of a community we need to ensure we create, model and nurture kindness, to ourselves and others. Over the next few weeks I would like us to focus on kindness. The building works combined with the wet weather are creating some challenges regarding space for students to play, parking and small things are escalating into big things because everyone is contending with so much already. These things can only be dealt with by kindness.

A question to ask your child/ren when they come home tonight is "tell me about a time today when you were kind?"
