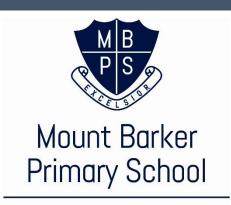
Mount Barker Primary School PBL Vision Statement

PBL at MBPS is:

Expected behaviours

Defining and teaching expected behaviour

At MBPS we teach the expected behaviours in all areas of the school through our school values of Respect, Responsibility and Resilien225ce. Positive Behaviour for Learning is about the school community coming to agreed expectations of student behaviour, so they know what the behaviour (for example, lining up) actually looks like.

Our explicit teaching allows students to understand the behaviour expectations without confusion. The expectations are taught step by step, just as we would approach any other learning at school.

Before teaching any new whole school behaviour expectations, we collect whole school data (not connected to any individual) to verify the level of frequency and steps within the behaviour needing explicit teaching.

When we create a new shared behaviour expectation, we create a lesson plan with clear steps and an instructional video for all teachers to teach in all classes across the school.

As part of the PBL approach short term token rewards may be used for students to contribute to whole school reward goals whilst learning new behaviours. This also enables all the adults in the school to focus on using specific positive feedback and shared language when positively reinforcing the desired behaviour. After teaching and practising the new behaviour (i.e. lining up) more data is collected to check if the explicit teaching was effective. This is just like we do in any areas of the curriculum and can help us better understand the most effective ways to support students with the new expectations.

Behaviour support focuses 'on what to do' rather than 'what not to do'. We have created signs for students with our current examples of desired behaviours visible around the school. Many of our explicit teaching interventions will support these expectations but we expect these to change and evolve over time. At the start of every year we will have a bank of explicit lessons to reteach.
