# DRESS CODE

UPDATED 2024

The Mount Barker Primary School dress code will be consistent with the policy of the Department for Education, as expressed in the Education Act. No student should be educationally disadvantaged for not wearing the school uniform. The school recognises the diversity of its community and respects the cultural and religious beliefs of its members.

## THE UNIFORM

**The uniform is based on the school colours of navy blue and white and is itemised below:**

- Plain navy blue pants or track pants (no denim jeans) or plain navy blue skirts, skirts or shorts (no bike shorts).
- Navy blue and white short sleeved polo shirts with SPF50 (available from Hills School Wear).
- Navy blue short or long sleeved polo shirt.
- Navy blue leggings.
- Navy blue jumper (no hoodies).
- School summer fabric dress button or zip, with collar.
- School winter fabric pinafore or skirt.
- Students are required to wear wide brimmed hats (logo hats available from Hills School Wear) during terms 1, 3 and 4 on days when UV rating is above 3. Please note strings on hats are not permitted.
- Students can choose to wear a navy beanie during the winter months. A MBPS school beanie design is available from Hills School Wear.
- Year 6 students: To encourage a greater sense of identity and responsibility, year 6 students may also wear a specially designed navy blue 'seniors' windcheater.

### Additionally...

- If parents choose to purchase polos, jumpers or jackets without a logo, iron on logos are available from the school office for \$3.50
- Sandals may be worn in summer (thongs are considered dangerous and are not permitted), whilst the wearing of closed in shoes is encouraged at all times.
- Jewellery can frequently be a health and safety risk and is therefore not permitted, other than sleeper or stud earrings, watches or medically required identification.
- The wearing of brand names on clothing is not permitted including football colours and beanies.
- SAPSASA State/National team commemorative tops may only be worn by students for 1 week (5 days) following competition.
- Hair that is longer than shoulder length should be tied back for health and safety reasons.
